




## How to Log in

- Enter the Go4Schools website through www.go4schools.com
- Click on the 'Parents' icon in the top right hand corner of the page.




- Enter the e-mail address that you have given to us for our records in the space provided under 'First-time User'
  - o If both parents/carers have provided separate e-mail addresses then both will gain access to their child's data.
  - If you have not yet provided us with your e-mail address, please send it in and we will add you to the system.







- You will receive an e-mail instantly from Go4Schools with a unique password that will allow you to access the data for your child/children. (You will be able to change the password later)
- Go back to the 'Parents' page on Go4Schools and enter your e-mail address and new password in the boxes at the top of the page.




- If you only have one child at Maplewell, you should now be able to see their page. If you have more than one child, you can click on one of their names to see their page.
- Before you do anything else, click on 'My settings' in the top right hand corner and follow the instructions to change your password.
- If you scroll down the page you will see a variety of information including academic progress, attendance and information about behaviour.





## **Academic Progress**

### **Key Stage 3**



#### At a Glance

The KS3 chart shows the progress your child has made since the start of the year.

The black line represents your child's starting point at the start of the year and the bars indicate how many footsteps they have made in each subject.



#### **Detailed Progress**

In KS3, the detailed progress will show your child's:

- **Start line** the grade they had achieved at the very start of the year.
- Current grade where the teacher thinks your child is working at now, based on a collection of assessments
- Min Target the grade that students should be aiming to meet or exceed, by the end of the year
- Progress Pace indicates the rate of progress your child is making. This is may change throughout the year.
- Breakdown an overview of the levels.
   Each level is then sub-divided into
   Beginning (B), Developing (D) and Secure
   (S).


### **Key Stage 4**

### **Detailed Progress**

In KS4, the detailed progress will show your child's:

- **Current grade** where the teacher thinks your child is working at now, based on a collection of assessments
- Min Target the grade that students should be aiming to meet or exceed, by the end of year 11 (end of KS4)
- Tracker indicates whether you child is off track, working towards target, on track to hit target, hit target or exceeding target
- Breakdown Gives a brief view of recent assessments. This will look different for each subject.
- Each level is sub-divided into Beginning (B), Developing (D) and Secure (S).

## **Attendance**

- The school's attendance target is 95%.
- Attendance data is not live and is always shown up to the previous day.
- One session equates to either a morning or afternoon.
- Attendance is from the start of the academic year.



### **Frequently Asked Questions**

#### I have lost my password – what do I do?

Go to the Go4Schools website, click the 'parents' icon and follow the 'Forgotten your Password' instructions.

#### My email address is not recognised – why is this?

Only email addresses registered with the school are recognised by Go4Schools. If your email address is not recognised it means that the school do not hold your email address information. Please contact the school on 01509 890237 and let us know the email address you would like us to hold.

#### When, and how often should I access Go4Schools

The information is always available so that you can access it when you wish. We would, however, advice checking approx. every fortnight. If new reports have been published you will receive an email alerting you.

#### What does the colour coding mean on the At a Glance charts?

### *If your child is in KS3:*

- We expect students to make a minimum of 3 footsteps in a year. If they are on track to make this progress they will be 'Jogging' and the bar will be green.
- If they are not currently on track to make this progress the bar will be yellow and considered 'Walking'.
  - All teachers are aware of students who are 'Walking' in their class and put 'inclass' interventions or extra support in place to boost progress.
- Students who are making better than minimum progress will be purple and considered 'Running'
- Students who are exceeding the progress expected of them are 'Sprinting' and the bar is coloured blue.





### If your child is in KS4:

- The charts for students in KS4 measure the distance away from their end of KS4 target. The centre black line represents their end of KS4 target. The bar should get closer and closer to the centre black line as they reach the end of year 11.
- Positive numbers represent that your child has 'hit' or is 'exceeding' their KS4 target.
- A negative number represents how many steps away from their target they are.
- The expected distance away from their end of KS4 target varies depending on the time of year.

### How do you calculate my child's targets?

The grade/target given in each subject suggests what your child could achieve based on the potential they showed at the end of year 6 (KS2) and following our own basket of assessments when they start with us. Our philosophy behind our target setting system is to set challenging but achievable benchmarks that will give each child the confidence and encouragement to make as much progress as possible.

### Minimum Target

- The 'Minimum Target' column is the grade that students should be aiming to meet or exceed, by the end of the year, if they are to making the 'expected progress' in a linear fashion. As with all targets, they are estimations of what each student 'should' get. This target has been described as 'a signpost, not a destination'. In other words, it is not certain that your child will achieve it and neither does it mean that they cannot exceed it.
  - Even if your child has not hit their minimum target in a year, does not mean they won't make accelerated progress the next year. The hope is that all students will hit their end of KS4 target by the end of year 11, we acknowledge this is not always a straight line.

#### **Current Grade**

- Throughout the year, the 'Current' grade will change. This will be to reflect the progress made as judged by the class teacher after summative and ongoing assessments.
  - A summary of these grades can be found at the bottom of your child's profile as well as in the reports made available to you.
