
Art

Thailand 2028

This October we have had the pleasure to take 17 aspirational and utterly inspiring young people on an expedition to Thailand. The students spent 5 days doing voluntary work at the Elephant Sanctuary, this included cleaning out the enclosures, building walls, general elephant husbandry cleaning, scrubbing and cooking authentic Thai food for the whole team. All the students worked incredibly hard and despite the humidity and high temperatures, did so with smiles on their faces. After 5 days of volunteering (with a few river swims and a turtle sanctuary visit thrown in) the students had 2 days of down time with paddle boarding, a local festival, a longtail boat visit to James Bond Island and kayaking!!

I am incredibly proud of all the young people involved and how they were able to travel to the other side of the world, 2×6 hr plus flights, airports, transits, different foods and cultures.

A huge thanks must go to the team that took the students and were on duty for 24hrs for 11 days, and Venture Force, who led this trip and trusted that our students could do it.
