

It is a wonderful collaboration with Caterpillar, who are looking into their own practice and upskilling their workforce on neurodiversity. Thank you to all of the careers team that made this possible. Mrs Braisby has delivered 2 rounds of training to management and employees at Caterpillar, in order to deepen their knowledge of people who have additional needs. Such partnerships cannot be underestimated and we are continually looking to build closer links with industry. These are key in providing further meaningful opportunities for work experience and having closer contacts with the world of work. As you can see from our newsletter, there are numerous careers opportunities on offer to our pupils. We aim to offer meaningful experiences for everyone throughout their time at Maplewell. We are continually looking at how we can best prepare our pupils to live independently and for the next steps in education and the world of work. Our predicted number of leavers from post 16 for July 2024 is higher than it has ever been, with some students only spending I or 2 years before moving onto college or the world of work. This is testament that our curriculum is better preparing them for their next steps in life. It is vitally important that pupils, school, parents and carers constantly keep life beyond Maplewell in focus, which brings aspirations into reality. I promise that, as a school, we will do our utmost to help everyone to realise their ambitions.


Creativity


