
DT:

Careers:

THOMAS FROBISHER – SPORTS LEADERSHIP PROGRAMME

Thomas's journey started when he applied to attend the Prince's Trust 'Get Started with Multi Sports' in the Easter Holidays. This was a four day face to face programme, which took place at king Power Stadium in Leicester. Thomas took full advantage of the sessions where he was able to take part in a variety of sports, plus learning about the different roles in sport. He was able to listen to inspiring speakers and gain insight into the workings of a football club. There was also a full stadium tour of the impressive King Power Stadium and lunch and travel costs were provided.

As Thomas had successfully completed the above course he was given the opportunity to enrol in the 'Works for All' programme which followed on. He attended every Monday for eight weeks and had the opportunity to engage in their taught Employability programme, weekly sports activities in the afternoon and Employment Activities to support a job application. As if all this was not enough, by engaging in the above programmes, Thomas had the opportunity to apply for The Sports Leadership programme. He was up against tough competition but to his credit gained a place on the programme. This programme is for twelve months starting off with a four day residential and then one evening a week, where he will be tutored to train a football team on an enterprise scheme.

Further Careers:

We recently held an event called 'Speedy Speakers' for some of our Year 10 students. It was organised by Leicestershire Carers in conjunction with our We Discover programme. We were fortunate enough to have two speakers from industry talk to the students about their businesses and how they benefited the community and especially how they catered for SEND.

Our first speaker was Tim Marren, CEO of Peter Le Marchant Trust, a Charity based in Loughborough offering canal boat day trips and holidays for people with any type of disability or health condition.

Our second speaker was Noel Singh, a Funding Manager from Leicestershire County council. He talked about other kinds of jobs you can get with the council, and about his own job as funding manager. Both talks were really informative and gave a great picture of the work they do. The students were all engaged and asked a number of great questions at the end.
