He is leaving Post 16 in order to take up full employment. Liam attended 2 interviews, at DHL and Amazon respectively. He was offered both posts and eventually decided on the latter. This is a truly remarkable achievement and one which I hope to see replicated in the coming years.

The past couple of weeks has entailed 2 weeks of transition for students moving into Post 16 next year. This has proved to be extremely successful and hopefully provide a more comprehensive transition that in previous years. Part of the transition saw Post 16 students enjoy a day at Sheffield Meadowhall shopping centre. The promotion of independence skills was fantastic, with students choosing where to lunch and which shops to visit. They were a credit to themselves.








YEAR 11 SPANISH

Maplewell Hall School have been working with specialised coaches covering a range of different sports; including Basketball– Leicester Riders, Football- LCFC, Rugby- Leicester Tigers, Cricket- Leicestershire CC, Dance- Moving Together and many more, helping to deliver lessons and prepare your child for competitions, as part of Physical Education lessons.

Throughout the year, with the help of these coaches, PE Departments and other members of staff, this year has been a very successful one at Maplewell Hall School in regards to competition and development for all students.

December 16

Our first outing was to the Curve theatre for a night at the movies where students performed the dance from High School Musical with Sophie Hockling (Moving Together) to a live audience. This was part of the student's Bronze and Silver Arts Awards specific to Dance.

A week later, Maplewell were invited to attend Aylestone Leisure Centre for a KS3 Sports Hall Athletics Final level 2! Throughout the day, students competed against a number of schools from around the county in events such as, foam javelin throw, chest push, speed bounce, target throw and relay races. A top 3 finish from Maplewell saw us through to the level 3 finials later in the new year.

January 17

We welcomed in the new year with a trip back to Aylestone Leisure Centre for Level 2 KS3 & KS4 Boccia tournament part of the Schools Sport Games. 12 students battled head to head with other schools across the county and even against themselves, to bring home a winner's trophy, and making it through to the Level 3 finals later in the year at Loughborough University.

It was an outstanding performance from the Eaves Classes, finishing 2nd and securing a place in the regional finials later in the year at Loughborough University.

May 17

Saffron Lane - Leicester KS3 and KS4 Athletic Championships. Students competing in 100m, 200m, 400m, javelin and long jump. Students from Maplewell gave it their all, in all events throughout the day, bringing home medals for a top 3 finish in a number of events.

Loughborough University Table Cricket Regional Finials; schools from Northampton, Lincolnshire and Nottinghamshire were no match for our student's- Maplewell Hall School finished 3rd narrowly missing out by 2 runs to finish 2nd, a fantastic effort from everyone.


