On Thursday 16th March, in collaboration with Leicestershire Careers, we were fortunate enough to take some students from Maplewell Hall School and Post 16 to Hinckley & Rugby Building Society head office. Our organiser and host was Denise Bradshaw, Executive Assistant to the CEO, who had planned an amazing work tour for our students to demonstrate the many roles available in their Building Society. On the tour our first stop was the IT Department conducted by a very enthusiastic



member of staff who we could see clearly loved his job. Next, we were shown the Finance Department and given an overview of how the finances work in a Building Society and the different types of accounts. The Mortgage Department was next on the tour and students learnt about the process of getting a mortgage and some very interesting questions were asked by the students. Lastly, they visited the Savings Department and learnt about the kinds of savings products they offer, and how the savings and investments supported the mortgages on offer. It was also made clear through some of the student's excellent questions, how it was possible to start at the bottom and have your training paid for to advance your career and move up to the higher salaries. 






Careers Fair 2023:

Runnymede Trust hold Art Workshops:

This week we had researchers from the Runnymede Trust hold Art Workshops for some of our students from Years 8, 9 and 10. The Runnymede Trust is a research facility who explore racial inequality within Britain and look at ways in which everyone can feel valued, share equal opportunities, lead fulfilling lives and a gain a common sense of belonging. Currently they are conducting research in the Arts, and as part of this they are talking to young people about their arts education; how they see the world of art, what they think should be taught about the arts and how they see the arts affecting their future. It was wonderful to see how strongly our students felt the arts were for everyone. They had some great ideas about how to open the art world up, how to encourage creativity and interesting ideas about the direction they felt the arts should go, both within education and the wider world. The researchers were blown by the discussions generated and were very complementary about the students who took part. Once the findings are collated, they will be back in touch and we will see what changes can be made, to support everyone accessing the arts. It is fantastic to see students at Maplewell driving such positive changes.
