There have been so many **exciting developments** that have taken place at Maplewell already this academic year. The year started with staff working in teams in order to secure as many donations from local and national companies as possible. The response was overwhelming and students now have so many options to choose from as part of our in-house reward scheme for good work and behaviour. A large number of students chose to use their tokens to attend a morning session at Rebound Trampoline Park in Ashby-de-la-Zouch, where they had the place to themselves. They had a fantastic time.

Last term saw Maplewell achieve an overall **outstanding** judgement from OFSTED for its **residential provision**, with no recommendations. The full report is on the OFSTED and Maplewell websites. Congratulations to all staff involved in helping to make it a truly amazing and unique experience for all students that have the opportunity to access residence. It makes a massive difference in many ways. The range of activities on offer and the opportunity to socialise outside of school hours with each other, is invaluable. Residence works for so many of our students.

The **Annual bonfire party and firework display** was truly magical and thanks to your generous support the event continues to grow. This enables the students to experience something that is spectacular in the calendar of events at Maplewell Hall School. Thank you to all volunteers on the night and a special thanks to Mr Whitsey, our Site Manager, who coordinated the event. He does an amazing job behind the scenes at all of our events.

I am thrilled to see the rapid development of **Maplewell Autism Partnership** (MAP), which caters for pupils whose main barrier to learning is autism. Robbie Jones is the Lead Teacher and, along with a very strong team, he has made a really positive impact. We already have 10 students on role in our specialised and nurturing provision, which is second to none in supporting students and helping them to succeed. This has been a great addition to the school and will continue to grow due to the school's excellent reputation. Next academic year will see the number of places double due to the high demand for MAP.

The school now has its own **Speech and Language Therapist** and **Occupational Therapist** to add to our own **Art Therapist**, Miss Gross, who has already made a real difference to so many of our students. We are currently in the process of advertising for our own Educational Psychologist. At Maplewell, I expect everybody to 'go the extra mile' for our students. That is the only way.

I would also like to take the opportunity to thank Martine Mears, and more recently Jo Chivers, who do an amazing job in supporting students, parents and carers. I know that many of you feel the same way too. What they do makes a real difference to many young peoples' lives. Thank you.

I am a very privileged and proud man to be Headteacher at Maplewell Hall School. It has been 4 years since I began the journey and the work is by no means done. However, I am confident that the staff team at Maplewell is stronger than it has ever been and have seen this during recent learning walks that I have undertaken with Mr Hoult. We both remarked how the classrooms are full of enthusiastic students who are eager to learn. Behaviour was also impeccable. Teaching at Maplewell is exceptionally strong across the board and support staff are skilled in helping students to work hard and succeed. As Headteacher, I am fully committed to doing the very best for every student in school, in order that they make meaningful progress with a sharp focus on preparation for adulthood and the world of work.
